The Data Correction Service (DCS) via Harrisburg Project's web site is now available and can be accessed at www.hbug.k12.il.us -> Tools & Services -> Data Correction Service or simply click the link below:

You can now begin to make online corrections to all 2013-2014 Special Education Private Facility and Personnel claims. Electronic corrections of claim data can be made through Friday, November 21st.

To access DCS you will need the *Hbug Login* and *Password* which can be obtained from *iepoint*> by going to *File* -> *System Maintenance* -> *View Site Configuration*.

Please note that the Special Education Personnel & Pupil APPROVAL files for the 2013-2014 school year are closed and may not be altered; however, you will be able to make adjustments to claim records that match to the approval file.
